Summary

Background

The Caring Community Program was initiated in early 2025 to celebrate individuals, groups, organizations, and programs in Buffalo Grove that embody the community's "Smart. With Heart." brand. This initiative recognizes outstanding contributions that enhance the quality of life, demonstrate leadership, and reflect the values of collaboration, compassion, and innovation within the Village.

Analysis

The program has a nomination process available through an online form open for at minimum four weeks before each recognition date. Nominations can be submitted by community members and must include a brief description of the nominee's contributions, alignment with the "Smart. With Heart." values, and their impact on the community. Nominations will be reviewed by staff with criteria for selection including impact, innovation, and alignment with Buffalo Grove's core values (thoughtful, compassionate, service, results, professionalism, innovation, integrity, teamwork/collaboration). Recommended honorees will be provided to the Village President for final approval.

Bi-annual presentations take place during Village Board meetings held in February and August. Each honoree will receive a certificate of recognition from the Village President and be publicly acknowledged for their contributions. Photos and brief descriptions of honorees will be shared on the Village's website and social media platforms to amplify recognition.

The Caring Community Program is an opportunity to uplift and celebrate the remarkable

individuals, groups, and initiatives that exemplify Buffalo Grove's "Smart. With Heart." ethos. This program will not only recognize excellence but also inspire continued community engagement and reinforce the values that make Buffalo Grove exceptional. This third recognition, on February 2, 2026, will recognize community members and groups who were each nominated by their peers: Kriti Mohan, Subathra Raju, Stevenson High School FBLA Chapter, and the BG Singers.

The recognitions will be shared on various communications channels. Future nominations will continue to be solicited one month in advance of the next recognition date.

Summary

Background

In August 2025, Aptakisic-Tripp School District 102 revised their student dropoff and pickup procedures at Tripp Elementary School to address local resident concerns and improve the process for staff, students, and parents. Minor time-restricted adjustments were made to the parking restrictions along portions of Highland Grove Road and Fabish Drive to accommodate these concerns. Village staff moved quickly to implement parking restrictions due to the start of the school year, but the area needed continued monitoring to ensure the needs of both the school and the surrounding neighborhood were adequately met.

Analysis

Since the erection of the signed parking restrictions in August, Village and School staff have observed traffic and parking in the area including covering signs to observe area affects. Staff determined that parking restrictions on the north side of Fabish Drive are overly restrictive. Staff from Aptakisic-Tripp School District 102 agree that parking restrictions in this area are not necessary given the success of their new traffic plan. Removal of the restrictions on the north side of Fabish maintains safe traffic patterns during heavy-volume drop-off and pickup times while providing residents and their visitors some relief from having to move vehicles along their property frontage.

Public works will coordinate signage changes and will lead coordination with school and Police enforcement communication.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PARKING RESTRICTION CHANGES ON FABISH DRIVE AT TRIPP ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

WHEREAS the Village of Buffalo Grove is a home rule unit pursuant to the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS the Village seeks to amend the Village of Buffalo Grove Municipal Code to provide for safe and efficient traffic flow surrounding Tripp Elementary School; and

WHEREAS Village staff and members of Aptakisic-Tripp School District 102 and Tripp Elementary School staff have been monitoring traffic closely following transportation and parking restriction changes at the start of the school year; and

WHEREAS the recommendations of the Village Engineer have been presented to the Corporate Authorities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Buffalo Grove, Cook and Lake Counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted and incorporated and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. Line N & O of Section 1303 C. of Article XIII of Chapter BG-11 of Title 10 of the Village of Buffalo Grove Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding thereto the following portions as shown by the underlined and highlighted text and removing the following portions as shown by the ~~struck through~~ text below as follows:

N. Fabish Lane: On the ~~north and~~ south curblines of Fabish Drive from Highland Grove Drive to 30 Fabish Drive, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., school days.

SECTION 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval and shall be codified.

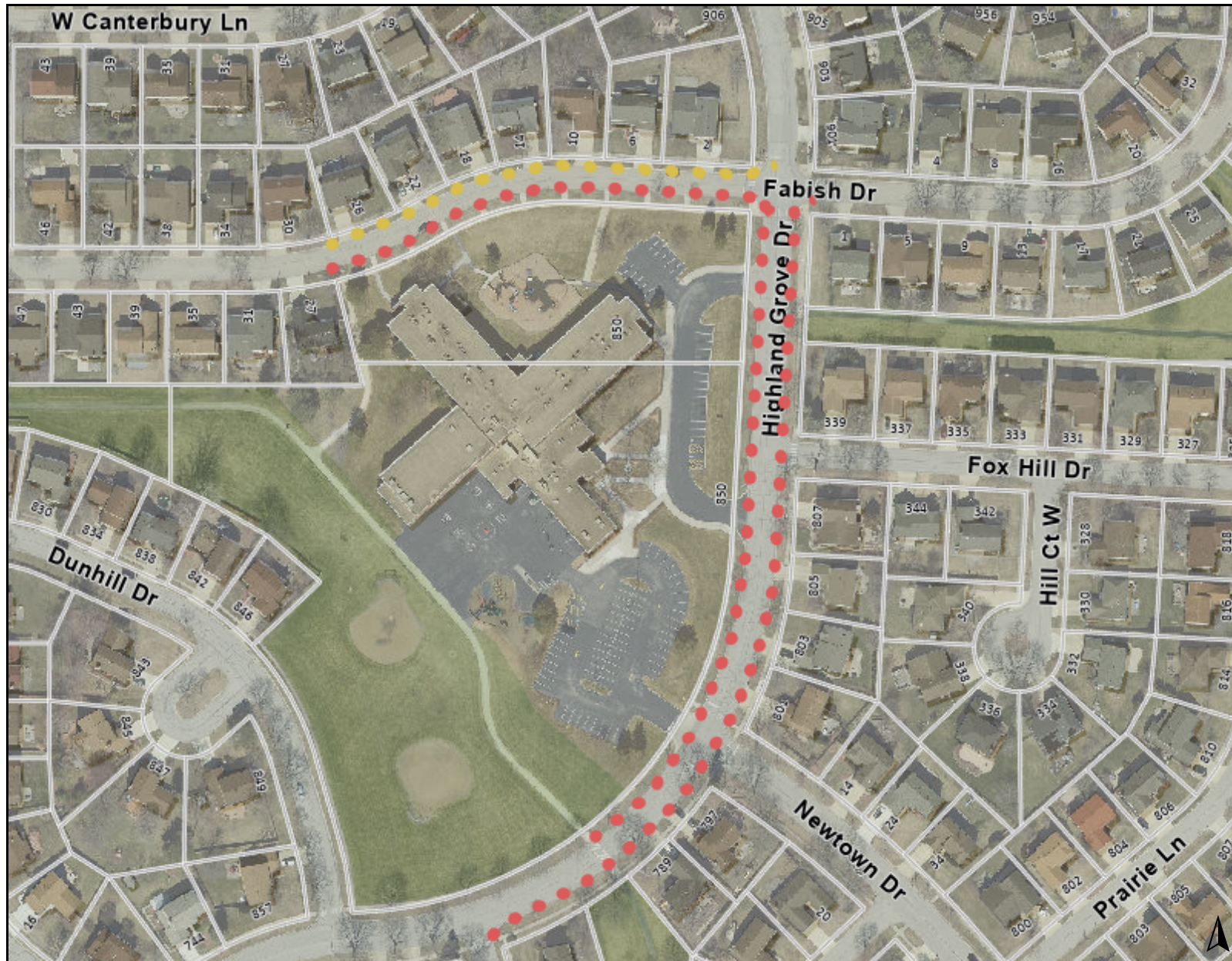

SUBJECT: Fire Department Fleet Replacement Vehicle 2026

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Village Board authorize the Village Manager to purchase one (1) Fire Department fleet replacement vehicle from Curie Motors, through the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative/Northwest Municipal Conference in accordance with the Illinois Joint Purchasing Act (30 ILCS 525/0.01 et seq.), in a total not to exceed amount of \$45,645.00, subject to final review and approval by the Village Attorney.

BACKGROUND

Staff requests authorization to purchase one (1) 2026 Ford Interceptor Utility Vehicle for the Fire Department. This unit is a scheduled fleet replacement for the Fiscal Year 2026 and its purchase and upfit are fully funded in the Fiscal Year 2026 capital reserve budget. I am writing to request your municipality's participation in Lake County's Private Activity Bond Clearinghouse (PABC) in 2026. Each year, Lake County Partners contacts the home rule communities in Lake County to request a pooling together of the volume cap to ensure the best use of our collective private activity bond allocation. The PABC cap for each year is transferred to the Village of Buffalo Grove, the Pool's host home rule community. *If your municipality is interested in participating, your governing body must approve a resolution and submit it to the Governor's Office before Friday, May 1, 2026. A sample resolution is attached for your use.*

Since its inception, the Lake County PABC has funded nearly \$200,000,000 in local projects, which has resulted in the construction of over 360,000 sq. ft. of new manufacturing space, the creation of 648 new manufacturing jobs, the renovation of 1,600 multi-family dwelling units, the purchase of an estimated 251 homes by first-time homebuyers, the expansion of a Montessori School, and the construction of a new solid waste disposal cell.

RESOLUTION 2026-xx

A RESOLUTION REALLOCATING 2026 VOLUME CAP TO THE VILLAGE OF BUFFALO GROVE, ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS the Village of Buffalo Grove is a home rule unit pursuant to the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, certain tax-exempt private activity bonds may be issued only if sufficient volume cap pursuant to Section 146 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”), is available for the bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Code, the Municipality has been allocated volume cap equal to \$135.00 per resident of the Municipality in calendar year 2026, or \$5,814,720 for the issuance of such tax-exempt private activity bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6 and Section 6.1 of the Illinois Private Activity Bond Allocation Act, 30 ILCS 345/1 et seq. (the “Bond Allocation Act”), and the Guidelines and Procedures promulgated thereunder, the Municipality may, prior to May 1, 2026, reallocate to other home rule units of government the volume cap allocated to the Municipality by the Code for their issuance of such tax exempt private activity bonds or for subsequent transfer or reallocation; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality has not used any of its 2026 volume cap and has no present intention to use the same; and

WHEREAS, the Lake County Partnership for Economic Development, Inc. has offered Lake County home rule communities the opportunity to participate in a program to combine their respective volume cap allocations and create a Private Activity Bond Clearinghouse Pool (the “Pool”) to facilitate the issuance of tax-exempt private activity bonds to finance manufacturing and multi-family housing commercial projects in Lake County, Illinois, for economic development purposes (“Eligible Projects”); and

WHEREAS, the Village of Buffalo Grove, a home rule unit of government (“Buffalo Grove”), pursuant to its Resolution No. 2001-51 adopted December 17, 2001, agreed to host the Pool and to reserve its own volume cap, and accept volume cap reallocated to Buffalo Grove by other home rule units of government, for the issuance of tax-exempt private activity bonds placed through the Pool to finance Eligible Projects; and

WHEREAS, Buffalo Grove has requested that the Municipality reallocate all of its 2026 volume cap to Buffalo Grove to be used for the issuance of tax-exempt private activity bonds placed through the Pool to finance Eligible Projects;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: RECITALS. The foregoing recitals are incorporated in and made a part of this Resolution by this reference as findings of the Village of Buffalo Grove

SECTION 2: TRANSFER AND REALLOCATION OF 2026 VOLUME CAP. Pursuant to Section 6 and Section 6.1 of the Bond Allocation Act and the Guidelines and Procedures promulgated thereunder, the Municipality irrevocably agrees to, and does hereby, transfer and reallocate all of its 2026 volume cap to Buffalo Grove to be used for the issuance of tax-exempt private activity bonds placed through the Pool to finance Eligible Projects as directed by the Advisory Committee created pursuant to Buffalo Grove Resolution No. 2001-51.

SECTION 3: AGREEMENT. This Resolution shall constitute the agreement of the Municipality to a different allocation under Section 146(e) (3) of the Code and the writing required under Section 6 of the Bond Allocation Act.

SECTION 4: WARRANTY. The Municipality covenants and warrants that it has taken no action or issued bonds that would abrogate, diminish, or impair its ability to fulfill the written agreement, covenants, and undertakings on its part under this Resolution.

SECTION 5: AUTHORIZATION. As required by the Bond Allocation Act and the Guidelines and Procedures promulgated thereunder, a certified copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the Office of the Governor of the State of Illinois. Any and all appropriate and proper officers, officials, agents, and employees of the Municipality are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to take all necessary and advisable actions, and to execute all such documents and certificates, as may be necessary to further the purposes and intent of this Resolution.

SECTION 6: MAINTAIN RECORD. The Municipality shall maintain a written record of this Resolution in its records for so long as the bonds to which the volume cap transferred by this Resolution is reallocated remain outstanding.

SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as required by law and is enacted by the Municipality pursuant to its powers under the laws of the State of Illinois and the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and its home rule powers.

BACKGROUND

Changes are proposed to the list of authorized local liquor licenses for the current license period through April 30, 2026. The updates are included in the attached ordinance updating Section 5.20.130. Explanations for the changes are as follows:

- A Class A liquor license for Ineozone Inc. d/b/a Kum Kang San Korean BBQ at 1333 Dundee Road is hereby rescinded at the request of the licensee. The Village was informed that the business is no longer in operation.

ORDINANCE 2026-xxx

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5.20 LIQUOR CONTROLS

WHEREAS the Village of Buffalo Grove is a Home Rule Unit pursuant to the Illinois Constitution of 1970.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Buffalo Grove, Cook and Lake Counties, Illinois, as follows:
